Knights of Columbus Gift to Facilitate Transfer of Stained Glass Windows

Rochester MN – The Rochester Knights of Columbus are pleased to announce a gift of \$15,000 to the Lourdes *Building Our Future* campaign. The presentation of this gift will take place on Friday, May 11 at 3:00 p.m. at the construction site for the new high school, at 19th Street and Valleyhigh Drive NW in Rochester.

The Knights of Columbus gift will fund the transfer of stained glass windows from the historic Lourdes High School Library to the new site. The windows, originally a gift to LHS from the Knights of Columbus, have been in place in the LHS Library since the 1940s. The three lancets of the windows depict philosophy, the arts and the sciences and were designed to provide a vision for the “students of tomorrow.” The centerpiece is Our Lady of Lourdes, as a symbol of healing through faith. The left lancet is dedicated to education through literature, astronomy, rhetoric and grammar; it features Plato, St. Thomas of Aquinas and the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington DC. On the right, science and the medical profession are the focus. Panels of the right lancet feature Hippocrates and St. Francis of Assisi, and are topped with an image of Mayo Clinic’s Plummer Building.

“Rochester Catholic Schools is committed to bringing the very best of what has made LHS great to the new building,” said RCS Director of Schools, Michael Brennan. “This includes the beautiful Library stained glass windows. We are grateful to the Knights of Columbus for making this move possible.”

“It is the distinct pleasure of the Rochester Knights of Columbus to fund the move of the stained glass windows to the new site,” said Council 1013 Grand Knight Robert Pyfferoen. “This gift renews the connection between the Rochester Knights and Lourdes High School and is a natural opportunity for us to support the building campaign and Catholic education.”

The windows will be placed in the new Lourdes High School Library, and will be acknowledged with a descriptive plaque explaining the symbolism of the windows and sharing the story of the connection between the Knights of Columbus and RCS.

The Rochester Catholic Schools system is a Christ-centered learning community that forms students who love, learn and live their faith in service to others. Rochester Catholic Schools provides academic excellence, faith formation and service learning experiences for 1,790 students in grades Preschool through 12. Lourdes High School is one of four schools in the Rochester Catholic Schools system.
