Diocese of Winona's Safe & Sacred Program

Brothers,

I recently completed the Safe & Sacred Program training from the Diocese of Winona website.

Luca has suggested that as many members of the council as possible should complete this training.

It is geared for adult volunteers like we Knights, who particularly have contact with our youth during our events. One event he mentioned was our annual Lenten Fish Dinners, and I would also recommend it for our Free-Throw Contest.

There are 4 separate modules to complete the training. It is not trivial, and will require a couple hours of your time (online).

Ladies Auxiliary Update – Margaret Schmid, Mark Zangs

“Right now the Knights of Columbus Ladies Auxiliary is in the formation process. We have to have a minimum number of eligible members in order to charter an auxiliary. Part of the process in starting an auxiliary is writing the By Laws, defining a Mission, electing officers, etc.

Membership in an Auxiliary, as defined by the state auxiliary, is as follows:

- Wives, widows and adult daughters of Knights in good standing.
- Members of the Auxiliary need not be Catholic.

The auxiliary will be comprised of three components--spiritual, service, and social. The main objective of the auxiliary is to support the council's endeavors and also to assist St. John's in areas of need.

Potential duties of a member would be to be committed to the organization by attending the meetings and participating in activities. Of course there are times when one is unable to do so due to illness, work, etc.

Dues would be whatever the charter group decides is necessary for operation. It could be \$15 to \$25 per year of which \$3 would go to the state auxiliary for state dues."

Brother Knights, I would ask that you share this information with your spouses and or other qualified women. Our next Informational Meeting has been scheduled for Monday, March 8th at 7:00 pm in the Parish Center Conference Room. Our first meeting was poorly attended. Only 3 ladies showed up and they were the three that I personally invited at the Donut Sunday. A Ladies Auxiliary would be a terrific addition to our efforts and to the mission of St. John's .

This year in response to the Holy Fathers decree of it being the year of the Priest, many Parishes started initiatives for additional prayers, Novenas, and Holy Hours for our Priests.

On Sunday, May 2nd the Knights of Columbus Family has been asked to participate in the 63rd Annual May Day Family Rosary Procession from the State Capitol to the Cathedral of St. Paul. We have partnered with the World Apostolate of Fatima to make this year's event special for our Priests.

In 1947, Monsignor Doherty, the Director of Catholic action initiated, a public demonstration of prayer at the St. Paul Cathedral in response to the rise of communism in Eastern Europe. The success of the prayer service launched the May Day Family Rosary Procession and it continues to this day. The procession began with a public demonstration of prayer to counteract the communist display of military power on the first day of May in Red Square in Moscow. To-

day we also use this powerful Marian prayer of the rosary to strengthen family life. That is the reason the first Sunday of May was selected for a counter display of spiritual might to offset worldly forces. Today we find ourselves in need of public witness of our Faith. As a family we find everything we believe in under attack.

We, as the Knights of Columbus since we stand in solidarity with our priests, have been asked to line John Ireland Blvd, from the State Capitol to the Cathedral with our membership. All Knights of Columbus members as their families are invited. We need about 1500 members to line both sides of the street. In order to make this event possible, all Councils who will be lining the street are asked to register prior to the event. Please wear your 4th Degree Tuxedo, if you have one otherwise please wear a KC hat, KC jacket, KC shirt, etc.

The Fourth degree will help with organizing the membership the day of the event. All Fourth degree members are asked to participate in the procession. The Honor Guard will lead and the membership in tuxedo will follow directly behind the Statue of Our Lady.

The Columbian Squires Color

Guard will carry the Papal and American Flag.

The Auxiliary will initiate a rose sale in their Parishes to help in promotion of the Procession. The roses will be carried in procession and given as an offering for the protection of our families, religious and priests.

Because of the special initiative this year to bring all Families together in one place, there will be no procession at the Basilica in Minneapolis. The Rosary Processions committee will be sending each District Deputy an information letter for each of their Councils.

Please mark your calendars to attend this prayer event. Bring your Families, Parishes, Religious and Priests. Parish and organizational banners are welcome.

Assembly time is at 1:30 pm at the State Capitol. Arrive a little earlier for better parking. The procession begins at 2 pm followed by a Holy Hour inside the Cathedral.

This event always occurs on the first Sunday in May. This year it is May 2nd.

A discussion of the types of requests, and the purpose of the fund was covered.

Lenten Fish Bake Report: The first dinner will be held this Friday the 19th. The poster featuring Holy Mackerel was unveiled. Radio spots will be on KNXR. All bulletins will have announcements. Posters were distributed for posting. New tickets will be used this year, which have been improved. The first dinner features the Lourdes Center Street Singers, and sponsored

by the St. Joseph Haitian Mission. All supplies should be set to go. Please respond when called about working the dinner. Applause was given to Mike K. for all of his work.

Grand Knights Report: Year end reports are due. Mark has developed spreadsheets for tracking volunteer hours and has created a form for entering hours, so that we can get credit for our volunteer hours. A form was used in the past to track events, including planning, help needed, that may be worth tracking down. The form may be put online to fill out electronically.
